news across the pews

Hello Everyone...

As I write this, it's been almost a month since Manson and Sheena left to their retirement. We have all felt the loss of our minister in the church communities of Dyce and New Machar, and we are naturally still navigating our way through a period of mourning.

In Acts, chapter 20, we find the Apostle Paul telling the Ephesian Elders that they would never see him again, because he had been compelled by the Spirit to go to Jerusalem where he would face imprisonment and suffering. After hearing the news, Luke records that they all cried as they hugged him and kissed him goodbye. (Acts 20:22, 37).

Many did the same with Manson, although his destination is very different to Paul's! Manson has gone to a well-deserved more restful and stress-free life and lots more golf!

When we lose someone, we love, it's normal and appropriate to mourn that loss and Jesus knows exactly how we feel. When we feel sad and burdened - He invites us to - come to Him...and He will give us rest. (Matthew 11:28).

However, Manson didn't want us to wallow in the past. In his last message to us - he asked us not to look back, but to look forward to whatever God has planned for us in the future.

Repeatedly in Acts 20, Paul reminds the Ephesians that it is God who builds His church - and although we no longer have Manson's leadership - God hasn't left the building! The Chief Shepherd is still with us - and He's going nowhere!

Jesus said, "I will be with you always, even to the end of the age." (Matthew 28:20).

God still has a plan for us - and it's a good plan a plan to prosper us - a plan to give us hope and a future. (Jeremiah 29:11).

In the interim, we carry on with the work we have to do - but it will also be a time for reflection and waiting. As I write, we are waiting for an Interim Moderator to be appointed and permission from Presbytery to call a new minister. But we are not sitting back on our laurels - we have started the preparatory work needed for entering into the vacancy process.

In the meantime, I have been appointed as your Locum Minister and will work with the leadership in both churches to ensure that the spiritual and pastoral needs of Dyce and New Machar are met. Services will continue in the normal pattern and all the normal outreach activities and other events will continue

We are likely to be in this vacancy period for a sometime, probably around 18 months to 2 years, so we will all need to patient and pull together during the weeks and months ahead. Continues overleaf

Vacancy

Well, we are in a Vacancy. This is my third vacancy since I became Session Clerk at Dyce in 1997. Going into a Vacancy may feel daunting to a congregation, and members will inevitably ask what happens now? Another question I hope you will ask. Is there anything I can do to help? The answer to that is YES, but more of that later.

At the outset, can I say that we are in a better position than in previous vacancies, as our locums were not known to us before appointment. Joan who has been our OLM for 5 years has been appointed locum, and we are very fortunate in this regard, since we already know her, and she knows us.

Joan as OLM was assigned to work pastorally for 10 hours a week, but this will now be extended by another 2 days per week and 2 Sundays per month. This means she will continue to be able to take services at Dyce and Newmachar. To enable worship services to be covered in both churches in the current pattern, the Worship Teams in each congregation will be required to conduct one service per month, when Joan is required to be in the other church, and when there are five Sundays when the **WORSHIP TEAMS** will both conduct services in their respective Churches.

Although the Kirk Sessions are keen to move things forward quickly, we are obliged to follow Church of Scotland procedures laid down by Presbytery. We await the appointment of an Interim Moderator, and once that happens, the following chain of events will occur.

The Presbytery will establish permission to call a Minister for the Vacancy. If this is approved a Vacancy Advisory Committee is appointed, which consists of 3 members of the Presbytery's Vacancy Procedure Committee and meets with the Kirk Sessions. A Nominating Committee (max of 13) will then be appointed from the congregations of Dyce and Newmachar. The Interim Moderator will oversee this process.

In the meantime, we are working on preparing a Parish Profile for the linked charge which will be issued to interested candidates. Electoral Registers for members/adherents is being finalised for submission to Presbytery.

In conclusion can I request that the linked congregations give Joan all the encouragement and support we can during the transition of this vacancy. If you are aware of any member struggling spiritually or with health issues please contact Joan, myself, Pastoral Care Teams or any member of Session so that we can assist and provide support or visit.

Joan said at the recent joint Kirk Session meeting that God already knows who our next Minister will be for our linked charge. We just need to be patient and work together until He reveals to us who that will be. In the meantime, please uphold the churches and all the work ahead in your prayers.




